RULES

- Exhibitors, except in the Open Division, must reside in the Show District which comprises the present parishes of Colton, Rusland, Satterthwaite, Finsthwaite, Lakeside and parts of Newby Bridge, Backbarrow and Haverthwaite, situated to the West of Lake Windermere and the River Leven.
- All Exhibits must be grown (for at least 2 months) or made by the exhibitor.
- The committee may inspect any Exhibitor's garden, either before or after the Show.
- All entry forms must be returned to the Secretary at least 7 days before the show. **This rule to be noted especially.**
- Exhibits are restricted to 3 for each exhibitor in each class, except Section 10, in which only 2 entries in each class are permitted for each exhibitor.
- Competition labels to be securely affixed to each exhibit.
- The arranging of all show exhibits to be done outside the show tent.
- All exhibits must be staged in the Marquee before 10 a.m. This rule will be strictly enforced. No exhibit should be removed before 4.30 p.m. Those not intended for sale by auction should be removed by 4.45 p.m.
- No person except the Secretary and those appointed by the Committee shall be present during the judging.
- The Judges may withhold a prize on account of insufficient entries and may award extra prizes to exhibits of outstanding quality.
- No article once exhibited in Sections 5, 6, 10 and 11, that has won a prize, can be entered in any further Show held by this Society.
- Prizes will be paid by persons appointed by the Committee in the Secretary's tent between 2.00 p.m. - 4.00 p.m. Only exhibitors will be allowed in the Secretary's tent during that time.
- Any complaint affecting the awards must be made in writing to the Show Secretary on the day of the Show, accompanied by a deposit of £2.00, which will be returned if the complaint is upheld.
- All exhibits, personal property etc., will be at the exhibitor's risk, and the Committee will not be liable for loss or damage due to any cause whatsoever.
- The holder of the Challenge Cup & Trophies for the Show, Sports and Hound Trails will be responsible for them and their safe return on or before the date of next year's show.
- Prizes not claimed by 31st August may be forfeited to the Society.

A black base cloth is permitted or the tray painted. Parsley garnishing is permitted but nothing else whatsoever.
